Celebrating 60 Years

In 1957, York County Natural Gas Authority accepted its first deposits for gas service and since that time has grown from a struggling public utility serving primarily industrial customers, to a thriving source of reliable energy for over 63,000 customers. From digging service lines with picks and shovels to trenching with joystick type controllers, technology and growth in York County and northern Cherokee County continues to boost the Authority's mission.

SOME HIGHLIGHTS FROM OUR HISTORY:

- YCNGA is a PUBLIC gas utility formed as a political subdivision of the State, governed and regulated by a 10-member citizen's
- From a building on Hampton St with 19 construction and service workers, the Authority now houses 90 employees at a campus on West Main Street that includes an administrative building, an operations center for construction, engineering and gas control, an appliance showroom, a LEED certified customer service center and Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) fast-fill fueling station.
- Initially supplied by the SC Pipeline Corporation, the Authority in partnership with Lancaster and Chester County Natural Gas Authorities formed the Patriots Energy Group (PEG) in 2001 and constructed a transmission pipeline to meet our customers and service area's continuous gas capacity needs while saving millions of dollars in reduced delivery charges.



HOW IT WORKS:

- We analyze your charges over the past 12 months.

- If your actual charges were LESS than your payments, a check will be mailed to you.

TO ENROLL:



Call customer service at **803-323-5304** *AFTER* you receive your May bill. Enrollment closes June 2. You must have 12 months of billing history to be eligible for the program.

ALREADY ENROLLED:

We will analyze your EBP account after the May bill and make any necessary adjustments. There is no need to call – the new payment amount will be shown on your June billing statement.

Keep Service Active over the Summer

It's cheaper to stay connected than to disconnect over the summer

Customers who disconnect and later reconnect at the same service location are charged a fee of \$125, which covers the cost of two service calls. Stay connected and qualify for our Equalized Billing Program which levels your gas bill over 11 months to a uniform payment.

April is National Safe Digging Month



As a homeowner you might think that calling 811 before you dig in your yard is unnecessary, but unless you have x-ray vision how do you KNOW what's lying just below the surface of your grass... or weeds?

KEEP THIS RULE IN MIND

If it requires a shovel, it requires a call!

Every digging job requires a call to SC811, from large-scale projects to smaller do-it-yourself projects.

Here are the top 5 reasons to call 811:

- 1 It's dangerous to dig without calling 811. You're putting your life in danger, and you're endangering everyone around you.
- 2 You could face big repair costs. Repairing damaged utility lines is very expensive.
- 3 It's the law. If you don't call, you could face thousands of dollars in fines and penalties.
- 4 You might knock out utility service to your neighborhood. Don't be that guy!
- **5** It's FREE and it's fast.

Why does Natural Gas Smell so Bad?

Actually, natural gas has no characteristic odor of its own – it's colorless and odorless as it comes from the ground. In 1937, after an explosion in New London, TX, legislation was adopted requiring all natural gas companies to use an additive in natural gas that would alert people to a leak. Natural gas now contains mercaptan, which give the odorless gas that 'natural gas smell.'

Many people associate the smell with sulphur, or rotten eggs. But like a fine wine, mercaptan can evoke different smells for different people. Whether it's a burnt match or cabbage smell, the odor should quickly alarm the senses.



The great advantage of using mercaptan as an additive in natural gas is that it can be detected by most people in extremely small quantities, less than one part per million. Tragedies like the New London School disaster of 1937 can easily be avoided today by properly maintaining and servicing gas appliances, and by calling in suspected gas leaks.
