
Carbon Monoxide Poisoning is 100% Preventable

KNOW IT, AVOID IT, PREVENT IT.

Carbon Monoxide is an odorless, colorless and tasteless gas. You *WILL NOT BE* able to sense a carbon monoxide leak. You have to know how to prevent it and avoid it. Awareness is key to prevention.

If you suspect carbon monoxide poisoning (see below for signs), immediately leave the building you are in and get outside to fresh air. Once out, call 9-1-1 and request medical assistance, if needed.





EASY PREVENTION TIPS:



INSTALL audible CO detectors on ALL levels, near sleeping areas in your home.



NEVER block ventilation.



Have all fuel-burning appliances serviced annually by a licensed contractor.



Notice the color of the flame on your appliances — a yellow flame signals poor ventilation.



Never use outdoor heaters or gas-burning tools indoors.



Keep portable generators outdoors and away from windows and doors.



Avoid idling cars inside closed garages.

Feel the Heat is a payment assistance program that provides financial help with natural gas bills. Donations are collected by the Authority and used to assist qualified applicants. Screening and funding decisions are made by partner agencies located throughout the county.

Qualified applicants include the elderly or disabled with family incomes at or below the Federal Poverty Guidelines; however, partner agencies may also refer cases based on emergency needs.
